The unsheltered street count was conducted using the Survey123 app, a tool selected for use by the local CoC that allowed teams of volunteers to conduct interviews electronically, instead of the traditional paper method for the ease of interviewing a person.

The unsheltered street count was conducted using an app, Survey 123 by teams of volunteers and staff assigned to their respective sectors of the City of Tucson. Interviewers had the option to interview individuals willing to complete an interview or record the observation of an individuals that were very likely experiencing homelessness. Consequently, there were two types of missing data in the data collected: 1) missing data when an interviewed individual declined to provide a response to data element required for HUD reporting, and 2) missing data on the demographics and experiences of those individuals who were only observed but not interviewed. In order to address these two types of missing data, the use of the HUD approved extrapolation was used to calculate the proportions of each demographic (age, race/ethnicity, and gender) found in the data for which there were valid responses.
