

389 adults were interviewed in May-June of 2023. 




Experience of Homelessness


Respondent is Experiencing Homelessness with...

All Respondents (n=389); BIPOC (n=265)




Main Reasons Respondent Became Homeless

Respondent Could Identify Multiple Reasons (All n=389; BiPOC n=265))




% Able to Meet Health Care Needs All or Most of the Time

% Able to Meet Behavioral Health Care Needs All or Most of the Time










Has the Respondent Stayed in an **Emergency Shelter in the Past?**



Has the Respondent Stayed in a Housing Program in the Last Year?




Has the Respondent Ever Done a Housing Assessment (VI-SPDAT)?

Average Monthly Income Including Benefits, by Age Group




Reasons for Not Seeking Employment

All Respondents Not Currently Seeking Employment (All n=275; BIPOC=166)




% With No Friends or Family

they can talk to about important matters




% With No Professionals
