Updates on Committee's Essential Functions

In our 3/10 meeting we reviewed the 2025 HIC/PIT numbers and a presentation on the LSA data for FY2025. This was followed by a discussion of the scope of activities with the SPAM committee's purview, a discussion lead by previous CoC Program Grant Committee members.

The 4/14/26 SPAM committee meeting involved the review of the SPM metrics for FY2025 and an extended review of the action items for the SPAM committee identified in the TPCH 2026-2030 Strategic Plan. These recommended activities are shaping the foci of the SPAM committee's work.

Updates on New Projects

In the strategic plan, the SPAM committee has been tasked with working to ensure that TPCH's housing referral, support, and placement processes operates as equitably and efficiently as possible. In TPCH's current strategic plan, our committee has been charged with: "improving collaboration with Public Housing Authority to streamline eligibility, referrals, housing access." In pursuit of this SPAM committee member Atticus Jaramillo has initiated a conversation with HCD's Antonio Carranza.

In addition, committee member Brian Liljegren has reached out to Daniel Davis at Padmission to gather information/resources about landlord engagement. Brian has also contacted Liz DaCosta about the planned roll out of new SOPs developed by AHCCCS.

SPAM Committee lead Keith Bentele also identified multiple areas where SIROW researchers are leading on items delegated to the SPAM committee in the strategic plan.

COMMITTEE NAME: Coordinated Entry

Motions Passed by the committee since the last General Council Meeting

Approved the question “Would you be open to sharing housing with another person if it could make housing more affordable for you? We may be able to match roommates based on Income. NOTE: This will not affect your housing assessment or 2 eligibility and is not a housing program.” and added to the HQ with a start date of April 6th. Adding in specific income questions as follows: “What is your regular monthly income?”, and “What is the source of your regular income?”

Finalized and approved an updated coordinated entry policies and procedures document.

Approved an amended (mostly clerical errors) Statewide Emergency Transfer Plan for people fleeing DV situations through the COORDINATED ENTRY process and approved a Statewide Gender-Based Violence policy, including receiving and referring to external CoCs when necessary. This was done in collaboration with HUD TAs and in accordance with the recommendations of Arizona’s CoCs and ESG partners.

Updates on Committee’s Essential Functions

Reconvening the Shared Housing Workgroup this month in collaboration with the LEC. We have been collecting income data and interest in a shared housing solution within COORDINATED ENTRY for almost a month now, so we will discuss the data, workflow, and rollout of this option for folks to self-resolve or stabilize post RRH/PSH exit.

Updates on New Projects

Working with SAAF and Emerge on fine-tuning the batch match process for VSPs through the COORDINATED ENTRY system.

Updating the Family HQ to include a note that explains housing eligibility if you lose custody or fail to regain custody of a minor child before a housing referral.

Beginning an annual re-evaluation of the HQ, the batch match, and the COORDINATED ENTRY system workflow
