
Men Experiencing Homelessness in Tucson

Short Report

389 adults were interviewed in May-June of 2023. This short report focuses on the demographics and experiences of the 252 respondents who identified as adult men, 251 of whom were cisgender men and 1 transgender man.








Respondent is Experiencing Homelessness with...

All Respondents (n=389); Men (n=252)




Main Reasons Respondent Became Homeless

Respondent Could Identify Multiple Reasons (All n=389; Men n=252)




% Able to Meet Health Care Needs All or Most of the Time



Most Common Benefits Received by Survey Respondents




"The children are with grandma and they're in housing. They're good. So I'm out here by myself dealing with this, and it's hard being homeless."


Has the Respondent Stayed in an Emergency Shelter in the Past?



Has the Respondent Stayed in a Housing Program in the Last Year?




Has the Respondent Ever Done a Housing Assessment (VI-SPDAT)?

Average Monthly Income Including Benefits, by Age Group




Reasons for Not Seeking Employment

All Respondents Not Currently Seeking Employment (All n=275; Men 151))




% With No Friends or Family

they can talk to about important matters




Food Security

"Explain how I became homeless? Okay, well, I lost my job. And losing the job, and I had no income. I have no family support or friends to where I could get support, at least financially. So I lost my apartment and I became homeless suddenly."
