

Motion:

Approve an amendment to the CoC Written Standards to add a new section titled “*RRH Continuity at Grant Closeout*,” establishing a narrowly defined, Coordinated Entry–controlled process for considering households exiting CoC-funded Rapid Re-Housing due solely to scheduled grant closeout, consistent with 24 CFR Part 578, prohibiting transfers or overlapping assistance, preserving prioritization for households experiencing literal homelessness, and directing the CoC Lead Agency to update Written Standards, Coordinated Entry policies, and related procedures effective February 12, 2026 .

Policy (Edited - in red):

If an individual or a household meets HUD’s definition of category 2 and is currently enrolled in an ESG or CoC-funded housing program that is ending within the next 14 days, **then** they will be eligible to complete a coordinated entry assessment. Once they have completed a new coordinated entry assessment, that individual or household will be added to **the** general batch list to ensure housing continuity in the case of grant closeouts. In order to be eligible to complete a new coordinated entry assessment AND to be added to the batch list, they must meet the following circumstances.

- The household is exiting RRH solely due to the scheduled expiration of the grant.
- The household was not terminated for noncompliance and did not voluntarily exit.
- The household met RRH eligibility requirements, including literal homelessness, at original program entry.
- The household is housed at the time of exit from the closing RRH project.
- The household demonstrates documented, imminent risk of losing housing without continued assistance
- There is no overlap of RRH rental assistance or services between grants.
